# Projects Funded for 2009 – 2010 School Year

The 13 projects funded in 2009-2010 total \$19,863. These projects not only enhance students' abilities in such traditional areas as reading, writing and math, but also include music, technology and life skills.

Children's Community Garden "Pea Pods": to develop and implement an organic garden at Tower Street Community Center. Pea Pods will be a place where youths and adults will grow and harvest vegetables, fruits and flowers.

Summer Family/Community Involvement & Library Program: to support summer field trips whose focus is to prevent academic regression over the summer in mathematics, reading and writing. Children will be required to complete a weekly packet to participate in each trip.

**Guitars for Kids:** to purchase additional guitars for use by students in the Westerly Middle School, Dunn's Corners, Springbrook and Bradford Elementary Schools.

**Baking and Pastry Equipment**: to allow students to learn and explore the varieties of baking techniques and methods in preparation in baking and pastry. This grant funds baking and pastry equipment.

**Bradford Community Center Activities**: to support weekly activities that expose children to different experiences through stories, arts and crafts, music and games. This includes the purchase of computers to further the use of technology.

**Turning Grease Into Fuel:** to sponsor the Westerly Innovations Network Junior team to bring their Turning Grease Into Fuel (TGIF) project to the Community Problem Solving Conference in Michigan.

Literacy and Math Games: to purchase FROG Family Fun Pack sets that will enhance instruction of literacy skills and math skills in a kindergarten classroom. Games will be played in class and sent home with children to bridge the gap between home and school in a positive way.

**Portrait Studio Photography**: to support camera, software and projector purchases to add Portrait Studio Photography to current Photographic Communications Course.

**Netbooks**: to provide funding for netbooks to help further enhance the use of technology based assignments and projects at Westerly Middle School.

**G.O.A.L Program**: to support an after school / Saturday program designed for children, whose goal is to stretch student's learning by providing an enriching curriculum



**Film Clips for Character Education**: to provide supplemental resources for an advisory program for 6-8 grade students that will focus on making them better students and citizens. This resource consists of an 8 episode set of movie film clips for Character Education.

I Have a Dream-College: to expose fifth grade students to the college environment, giving them an image to associate with the word. Students visit the University of Rhode Island for a day and interacted with students and faculty.

The Build-A-Book Literacy Program: to provide students with tools and techniques to enhance their creative writing skills and generate excitement about the writing process; thus empowering them to meet or exceed current writing standards.
