Welcome to the Westerly Education Endowment Fund's first newsletter! We appreciate your support and wanted to share all the good news that is going on. We hope to issue our newsletter quarterly. We hope you enjoy it and welcome any feedback you may have.

## Grants Awarded for 2009 to 2010

Thirteen grants totaling \$19,413 have been awarded for the 2009 to 2010 school year. The following grants were funded:

**Baking and Pastry equipment** for the high school culinary class: this equipment will allow students to learn and explore the varieties of baking techniques and methods in preparation of baked goods and pastry.

**Bradford Community Center Activities:** weekly activities that will expose the children to different experiences through stories, arts and crafts, music and games.

**Children's Community Garden "Pea Pods",** to develop and implement an organic garden at Tower Street Community Center. Pea Pods will be a place where youths and adults will grow and harvest vegetables, fruits and flowers.

**Film Clips for Character Education,** to support an advisory program for 6-8 grade students that will focus on making them better students and citizens. This resource consists of an eight episode set of movie film clips for Character Education.

**G.O.A.L Program,** an after school / Saturday program for children whose goal is to stretch the students' learning by providing an enriching curriculum, mentors and a forum for presenting the students' work.

**Guitars for Kids:** music teacher David Harrington will utilize guitars for Dunn's Corners, Springbrook and Bradford Elementary Schools in his music program.

**I Have a Dream-College,** to expose fifth grade students to the college environment, giving them an image to

associate with the word. Students will visit the University of Rhode Island for a day and interact with students and faculty.

**Literacy and Math Games:** this grant will be used to purchase FROG Family Fun Pack sets that will enhance instruction of literacy skills and math skills in a kindergarten classroom. Games will be played in class and sent home with children to bridge the gap between home and school in a positive way.

**Laptops:** to fund sixteen computers to be put in a cart at Westerly Middle School to help further enhance the use of technology based assignments and projects in the classrooms.

**Portrait Studio Photography,** to provide funding for camera, software and projector to add Portrait Studio Photography to current Photographic Communications Course.

**Summer Family/Community Involvement & Library Program:** this grant will fund summer field trips whose focus is to prevent academic regression over the summer in Mathematics, Reading and Writing. Children will be required to complete a weekly packet to participate on the trip.

**The Build-A-Book Literacy Program:** this grant will provide students with the tools and techniques to enhance their creative writing skills and to generate excitement about the writing process; thus empowering them to meet or exceed current writing standards.

**Turning Grease Into Fuel:** WEEF helped sponsor a team to bring their project to the Community Problem Solving Conference.
